

# MAKER PASS FAQ

## What is the Maker Pass?

The Maker Pass grants equipment and tool access to Jacobs Hall and the CITRIS Invention Lab once you have completed the relevant safety trainings.

## How do I get a Maker Pass?

### Step 1: Get Approved

- Students enrolled in a course held in 210, 220, or 310 Jacobs Hall are automatically approved to receive a Maker Pass for the semester and can proceed to step two.
- Other active UC Berkeley affiliates (students, faculty, and staff) from all across campus can request Maker Passes as capacity allows. Request access at <http://makerpass.jacobshall.org>.

### Step 2: Semester Access Fee

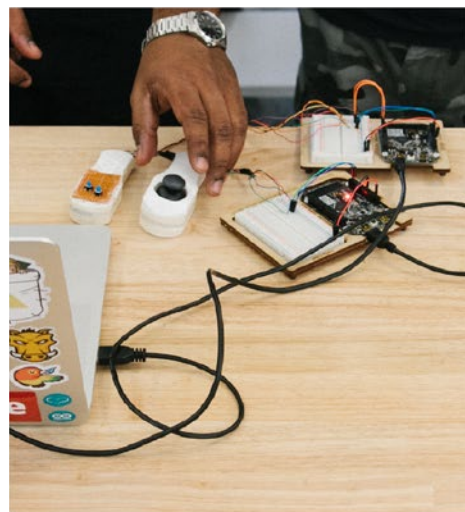
- A Regular Maker Pass is \$75. A Research Maker Pass is \$225.
- Fee waivers are available for students with financial need.
- Payment methods and the fee waiver form are available at <http://makerpass.jacobshall.org>.

### Step 3: Safety Training

- All approved users who have completed payment must pass the General Workshop Safety (GWS) training: <http://gws.jacobshall.org>.
- Those who have passed the training in prior semesters do not need to retake it, unless it is deemed necessary by Jacobs staff on an individual basis.

## When will I get access?

Once you complete **all three required steps**, your Maker Pass will be activated within 2 business days via your Cal 1 Card.



## Can I take hands-on trainings if my Maker Pass is not yet activated?

Because hands-on equipment trainings are delivered in the makerspace, and access to the space is limited to Maker Pass holders, you must activate your Maker Pass first.
